2015 Camping Runs

For the past several years we have conducted a vote at Victoria Day for the places to camp the following year. Based on the wishes of the group, and balancing distances, we have been able to usually book the group sites for the number one and/or two choices of the group. Here are the results of what we booked for 2015

May 15-18 Victoria Day – Pine Flats Campground near Ardenvoir, WA

We have been doing our kickoff camp at Pine Flats near Entiat, WA for several years. This primitive campsite offers great space and privacy for a fun long weekend. Some members will arrive on Thursday, May 14 but the camp officially starts on Friday. Pine Flats becomes our central location for day rides and camp activities as we truck in a full kitchen to provide all the meals for the weekend.



This weekend also allows all vehicles, so you can bring your non-riding partner or friends as well as that tent that is too large for your bike.

We expect a large crowd that always has a great weekend. Early registration gets you a discount.

June 18-21 Bear Hollow County Park near Fossil, OR

Our June camp is at Bear Hollow Park just south of the town of Fossil, Oregon. This is About 175 miles or 3 hours from Portland; 300 miles or five hours from Seattle; and 675 km or 7 hours from Vancouver, BC.

We have rented the entire park so there is plenty of space to spread out. The park has water and vault toilets. Showers are available in town. A variety of day rides on Saturday take you on some spectacular roads and the options for short hikes in the John Day Fossil beds. We were at this campsite in 2013 with 50 participants who enjoyed some great day rides

July 17-19 Dry Falls State Park near Coulee City, WA



We planned to go to Steamboat Rock for July, but that group camp has been closed. At the suggestion of the park ranger we selected Dry Falls State Park is near Coulee City, WA which is 200 miles or 3-3.5 hours from Seattle depending on the route. It is 475 km or 5 hours from Vancouver, BC and 300 miles or 5 hours from Portland.

Located among the cliffs of the Grand Coulee it offers some outstanding scenic rides. The campsite has vault and flush toilets and nearby showers. Some campers might take the opportunity to visit Grand Coulee Dam.

August 14-16 Paul Lake near Kamloops, BC

This campsite is located 375 km or 4 hours from Vancouver, BC; 300 miles or 5 hours from Seattle; and 475 miles or 8 hours from Portland. Our OR riders might plan on making this a two day ride. Border Riders camped at Paul Lake in June of 2011. The group campsite has a large grassy area and a covered shelter. It is located across the lake from the public area where showers are available.

Day rides will include both loop rides with great scenery and some fun destinations.



Sept 18-20 Kanaskat-Palmer State Park

Another group site that closed on us was Deception Pass and the temporary site lacked privacy and decent tent space. We elected to return to K-P State Park near Enumclaw, WA where we camped in September of 2013. Kanaskat-Palmer is a great group site centrally located for members and guests. The camp is about 40 miles from Seattle; 280 Km from Vancouver; and 175 miles from Portland. This site has a large group site with covered picnic area, fire ring, lots of tenting space, and two lean-two structures with eight wooden bunks. Rest rooms and four showers are within feet and there is lots of paved parking space.
